

Taos High School Hybrid Reentry

Families have the option of continuing remote learning throughout the school year. Those who choose the hybrid option will be divided into two groups:

- Group A will be on campus Monday/Tuesday and will learn remotely Wednesday-Friday.
- Group B will be on campus Thursday/Friday will learn remotely Monday-Wednesday.
- Wednesdays will be used for deep, deep cleaning in preparation for the Group B students.

Taos High/Chrysalis School will be doing the following hybrid model. We are surveying students to determine which option they want to commit to starting on Feb. 22nd. As more teachers are available, we will add them to the appropriate option. Those with high needs (connectivity, not academically successful) will be prioritized first.

Option 1: Students who commit to 2 days of in-building learning will arrive at 7:45 and report to their academic support cohort (beginning with PODS up to 10 students depending on 6ft social distancing requirements) where they will receive academic support from 8:00-9:30. From 9:30-2:20 these students would remain with this teacher and attend their online courses. From 2:20-2:35 they will receive additional academic support and return home. They will have lunch from 11:35-12:20. There will be no switching of classes to maintain cohorts within the schools. Teachers are available for individual and small group support during office hours/academic support.

Option 2: Students who need tutoring or occasional support will sign up for in person academic support and tutoring outside of school times following small group guidelines. They will still attend all their classes online. Teachers are available for individual and small group support during office hours/academic support.

Option 3: Students will attend all classes online and do not need/want additional academic support. Teachers are available for individual and small group support during office hours.

- Students should stay home from school if they exhibit any symptoms or have a temperature of more than 100.4 degrees.
- Students should stay home if they have been in close contact with someone with symptoms or has tested positive for COVID.
- Call the school and talk with Nurse April at 575-751-8074 or April DeHerrera <april.deherrera@taoschools.org> to find out when it is appropriate for the student to return.

- If students show symptoms of COVID while at school, they will be sent home.

Discipline

- Students who violate social distancing and PPE requirements will be given one warning. On the second offense, the teacher will notify the site supervisor and the student will be removed from the classroom.
- A student who willfully coughs, sneezes, spits, or breathes, on any staff member or student, or who willfully disregards social distancing or PPE requirements, will be suspended from school and allowed to return only after a behavioral contract is signed by the student and parent.
- Students who are suspended more than twice for discipline issues related to improper use, or willful disregard, of safety standards will be placed on a 100% remote learning plan.
- Willfully spitting or coughing on another person at a school site will be treated as an assault and law enforcement will be contacted and a report will be filed.
- A parent or visitor who commits such an assault will be banned from entering any district building for the rest of the school year. Law enforcement will be contacted and a report will be filed.
- An employee who commits such an assault will be placed on paid administrative leave pending a district investigation of the incident and may have disciplinary documentation placed in his or her file.

Ventilation

- Doors and windows should remain open, weather and air quality-permitting, to provide fresh air.
- Maintenance staff will continue to maintain school heating and air conditioning systems as recommended by the manufacturers.
- HEPA Filters will be installed (1/2) in every classroom.

Hygiene

- Students and staff should wash their hands whenever transitioning from one part of the school to another. Wash with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds (try singing the Happy Birthday song).
- Soap and hand sanitizer will be provided for classrooms and public areas, including a sanitation tote for each classroom for periodic cleaning throughout the day.
- Students should avoid sharing or touching other people's property.
- Students should bring their own water bottles to school each day. Automated water bottle stations are available at all schools.
- Students and staff should avoid touching their faces.

Cleaning

Schools will be cleaned following EPA and CDC guidelines, including regularly disinfecting and sanitizing high-touch areas with deeper cleaning between groups of students on Wednesdays and Friday evenings.

Laptops/iPads

Students will be expected to bring their fully charged THS-issued technology devices (and charging cord) to school with them for in-person instruction.

Masks

- Students, staff, and visitors **must wear multi layered face coverings** on campus except while eating, drinking, and teaching word-formation.
- This includes in classrooms and in all common areas.
- Students are asked to bring their own masks, though extras will be available at school.
- Face shields aren't a substitute for face masks.

Social Distancing

- Students and staff must adhere to social distancing requirements, meaning they should be at least six feet apart.
- Furniture may be rearranged in classrooms to allow for social distancing.

Meals

- Breakfast and lunch will be served when students are on campus.
- [Grab and Go meal distribution](#) will continue during hybrid learning (though sites may change).
- Weather-permitting, students will eat breakfast outside; otherwise, they will eat in their classrooms.
- Students will eat lunch supervised, in their small groups, in their classroom or outside in the Spring.
- The lunch schedule will be staggered to allow for social distancing and cleaning between groups.

School Offices

- The school office will be open for student/parent needs.
- Parents/guardians must wear a face mask, have their temperature checked, and fill out the COVID-19 visitor symptoms review prior to entering.

- It is strongly encouraged to utilize email or calling the office to handle office communication attendance reporting.
- There will be no volunteers or chaperones allowed on campus at this time.

Break Time/Transitions

- The movement to and from classrooms will be staggered among student groups to assure social distancing. Hallway patterns will switch to a one-way model.

Physical Education

- Physical education will continue to be an integral part of the curriculum. The curriculum and associated activities will be tailored to allow for individual exercise, conditioning, and workouts.
- Team sports or contact of any kind will be removed from the curriculum.

Plan for Positive Cases

- The district works closely with the New Mexico Department of Health to decide whether to close a classroom, a portion of the building, or the whole school and for how long.

- As part of our protocol, we will let the school community know about the incidences of COVID-19 positive and exposures on campus.
