Only the following are allowed:

- religious beliefs
- ethnicity
- identity

The above represents who **'you'** are but will not show offense to any individual in the graduating class, including guests who will be present at the ceremony.

The following decorations or themes will be prohibited:

- Drugs and/or Alcohol paraphernalia signs, slogans, or imagery
- Gang affiliated signs, slogans, or imagery
- Profanity
- Sports team logos
- Slogans, images, or symbolism that incite segregation or prejudice towards any group or individual.
- Political party, affiliated signs/ statements, slogans, or imagery

This is a **privilege**. Please use good conscience when decorating your cap to make it about who **'you'** are on a deeper level without causing division amongst your peers or individuals in our community.

If there is reason to believe a decorated cap has violated the guidelines stated above, you will be asked to meet with administration and discuss alternate options.

In the assignment answer the following:

Question 1: Please submit a photo of your decorated cap. This is a requirement for all students who are planning on attending commencement with a decorated cap. Your submission will be reviewed, and administration will determine approval prior to class night and commencement.

For Question 2: We would like you to provide a narrative describing your cap decoration and how it embodies your religious beliefs, ethnicity, or identity.
