- **Reading** - all students will show an 10% increase in reading proficiency as measured on the New Mexico Measures of Student Success and Achievement (NMMSSA).
- **Math** – all students will show an 15 % increase in mathematics as measured on the New Mexico Measures of Student Success and Achievement (NMMSSA).

- Numbers & Operations in Base Ten (NBT)
- Numbers & Operations – Fractions (NF)
- Measurement & Data (MD)
- Geometry (G)
